Dear Parents:

The enclosed interim report provides students and parents with timely feedback regarding the current level of achievement, as well as an update on core learning skills. The grade on this report is a cumulative mark and represents the most consistent level of achievement since the beginning of the school year. Please feel free to individually contact subject teachers should you have any concerns about a mark in a particular subject.

Final Evaluation begins in all classes on Wednesday, May 29th. Teachers will distribute to students via Groodle a copy of the format for final evaluation in each course prior to April 29th. Students will receive a final evaluation schedule during the week of April 22nd. Review week will run from Tuesday, May 21st to and including Tuesday, May 28th. The final evaluation period then runs from Wednesday, May 29th to and including Tuesday, June 11th. Beginning on Monday, May 27th classes or evaluations will begin at 8.30 am each day.

Classes will follow the regular timetable throughout the week of May 21st. There will be a different timetable beginning on Monday, May 27th and running throughout the final evaluation period. This will be distributed to students during the week of April 22nd.

During the final evaluation period, parents should continue to report absences to Roberta Greenberg. Students who are absent for a final evaluation activity will need to produce a medical note verifying the absence. Students in Grades 7-8 are expected to attend all supervised study sessions and activities scheduled throughout the final evaluation period. These will be linked to the term work from their courses or to their adviser goals.

All students are encouraged to attend final evaluation return day on the morning of Thursday, June 13th beginning at 8:30 am. Representatives from Alpha Textbooks will be present on this day to process the return of used textbooks. Students who return their texts will receive a credit on their Alpha Textbook account.

Over the remaining weeks of the year, teachers will be working collectively to ensure that students end the year successfully. Success Centre staff are available to provide students with any additional organizational support that may be required. Throughout the remainder of the year, the Success Centre will operate from 7:45 am to 5:00 pm.
